

Pillar 1: Leadership & Accountability

Activity A: Safety & Health Pledge Ceremony

- **Timing:** Formal event on March 4th. 
- **Action:** Senior leaders must lead the pledge.
- **Purpose:** Demonstrates top-down commitment and strengthens accountability.

Activity B: Safety Flag Hoisting

- **Action:** Unfold the National Safety Day flag  followed by a safety speech.
- **Purpose:** Symbolic action to strengthen visibility.



Pillar 2: Visual & Competitive Engagement

Getting people involved makes them take safety seriously.



Actionable Ideas

- **Competitions:** Run poster making and slogan writing contests.
- **Gamification:** Host safety quizzes and cleanliness challenges.
- **Proactive:** Organize "Hazard Hunt" identification drives.
- **Goal:** Make safety visible, competitive, and creative.


